

**GRASSTREE MINE EXTENSION PROJECT  
(EPBC 2018/8171)  
INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT**

The following notice is published pursuant to Section 95A(3) of  
the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act).

Anglo Coal (Capcoal Management) Pty Ltd is proposing to develop the Grasstree Mine Extension Project, which involves extending the current Grasstree Mine by five new longwall panels within the existing German Creek mining complex (Mining Lease 1831). The northern boundary of the German Creek mining complex is located approximately 8 km south-west of Middlemount in Central Queensland.

The proposed action has been determined to be a “controlled action” under the EPBC Act. The controlling provision under the EPBC Act is listed as “*listed threatened species and communities (sections 18 & 18A)*”.

The Commonwealth Department of the Environment and Energy has advised that the project will need to be assessed through preliminary documentation. The preliminary documentation for the proposed action will be on display from Thursday 01 November 2018 to Wednesday 14 November 2018 at the following locations:
